James was born in Mexico City. He was admitted to practice law in Mexico in 1989. He joined Ritch Mueller in 1992 and was a partner of the firm from 1996 to 2011. James was a foreign associate at Debevoise & Plimpton in New York City in 1991. He is counsel of Ritch Mueller since 2016.

He has extensive experience in competition and antitrust, finance and mergers & acquisitions, including private equity, project finance, structured finance, cross-border secured and unsecured loans, debt and equity offerings.
